

Method of Payment: Larkspur Recreation accepts Visa, MasterCard, cash and checks. There is a \$20 charge for returned checks.

Program Cancellations/Modifications: Larkspur Recreation reserves the right to cancel or modify a program due to low registrations or other unforeseen circumstances. Registrants will be notified by email if changes occur to their programs.

Refunds: A request for a refund due to withdrawal from a program must be made to the recreation office a week prior to the start of the first class. Refunds are subject to a \$10 service charge. If a program is cancelled by Larkspur Recreation, a full refund will be issued. Some programs such as Super Cool Summer School have separate refund policies.

Residency Status Information:

- 1. For the use of facilities and programs located on property owned by the Corte Madera-Larkspur School District, Reed Union School District, and Tamalpais Union High School District (Neil Cummins Gymnasium, The Cove school/park, Tennis Courts at Granada School, and Town Park's softball and soccer fields), "residents" shall mean individuals who reside in, or groups and organizations which have their principal place of business located within the County of Marin.
- z. For the use of all other facilities and programs located on property owned by the Town of Corte Madera (Town Park other than the areas mentioned in (1) above, Piccolo Pavilion, and Community Center) "residents" shall mean individuals who reside in, or groups and organizations which have their principal place of business located within the Town of Corte Madera.





ALL ABOUT THE CORTE MADERA AGE-FRIENDLY INTERGENERATIONAL CENTER

In 2017, the Age-Friendly Corte Madera task force, developed a Strategic Plan which included outlining goals to encourage the development of an Intergenerational Center where people of all ages could participate in quality programs, some together and some separately. (www.agefriendlycortemadera.org) After studying the benefits, we determined that there were intrinsic, meaningful advantages that would have positive impacts on our community if we were to have an Intergenerational Center.

In order to financially support programming for the Center, Age-Friendly Solutions, a 501 (c)(3) tax exempt organization was established to generate adequate funds to realize these goals. The Town provided the space and underwrote the cost of furnishings, site modifications and staffing, and the AFIC Task Force developed the programming.

Age-Friendly Solutions solicited grants that allowed The Intergenerational Center to offer programs at no charge for 2018 to those who made a modest, tax-deductible donation. For Corte Madera residents, we request a \$15 donation and for those living outside Corte Madera, a \$25 donation that permits the "Gold" and "Silver" members to participate in any and all programs at no cost. Our goal for 2019 is to be able to offer the same privileges. We would heartily appreciate any donations to ensure the Intergenerational Center's success and growing participation.


