Method of Payment: Larkspur Recreation accepts Visa, MasterCard, cash and checks. There is a \$20 charge for returned checks.

Program Cancellations/Modifications: Larkspur Recreation reserves the right to cancel or modify a program due to low registrations or other unforeseen circumstances. Registrants will be notified by email if changes occur to their programs.

Refunds: A request for a refund due to withdrawal from a program must be made to the recreation office a week prior to the start of the first class. Refunds are subject to a \$10 service charge. If a program is cancelled by Larkspur Recreation, a full refund will be issued. Some programs such as Super Cool Summer School have separate refund policies.

2. For the use of all other facilities and programs located on property owned by the Town of Corte Madera (Town Park other than the areas mentioned in (1) above, Piccolo Pavilion, and Community Center) "residents" shall mean individuals who reside in, or groups and organizations which have their principal place of business located within the Town of Corte Madera.



AARP Smart Driver Course

Community Information

The Corte Madera Lions Club was chartered in 1951 by a group of 25 local civic-minded men who felt that Corte Madera needed a service organization to help set up youth activities for children in our community. Aside from schools and churches there were no facilities for large events, so the Lions met this need by raising



funds and building the current Community Center as a labor of love, with mostly volunteer labor.

The building was donated to the Town of Corte Madera in 1986, but the Lions, now composed of men and women of all ages, are still actively involved in helping maintain it. In 2010, the Lions partnered with the Corte Madera Community Foundation, the Women's Club and the Beautification Committee to renovate the patio. In 2013, the Lions helped with renovation of the main hall.

The Lions Club supports many community organizations including the Boy Scouts, Canine Companions, AdvoKids, Twin Cities Little League, Twin Cities Police Authority Youth Programs, Redwood High School, Neil Cummins Elementary and Hall Middle School. The Lions are an integral part of Corte Madera Oktoberfest, and we always have a food and drinks booth for the 4th of July Festival. We host many social events throughout the year at the Community Center including Casino Night, and we provide volunteers for several community events including Breakfast with Santa and the Opening Day of Soccer.

Lions Club International supports vision programs around the world, and we collect old prescription eye-glasses and hearing aids for distribution in third world countries. These items can be dropped off at the Community Center lobby during normal working hours.



Age-Friendly Corte Madera is dedicated to creating physical and social environments that support & enhance healthy and active aging, and an optimal quality of life for our older residents.

In the event of a major disaster, professional services may be overwhelmed and unavailable for long periods of time. The widespread needs of the town will depend on



voluntary assistance. With this in mind, the fire departments in Marin County have adopted a citizen training program called Community Emergency Response Training (CERT).

CERT is designed to provide hands-on training to become selfsufficient for at least 72 hours following a disaster such as an earthquake, flood, or a wild land fire. We then encourage CERT trained volunteers to join their neighborhood teams to assist their community.

Central Marin NRG Program

NRGMARIN.ORG is the website for Central Marin Neighborhood Response Groups.

Established in 2007, the NRG Program covers 4629 homes with 33 individual neighborhoods organized, or 48% of homes in Corte Madera, Larkspur and Greenbrae.

The NRG program supports families by organizing neighbors to help each other. We create neighborhood communication networks to share when it's a high-risk fire day (Red Flag Day), and phone trees and text trees to share evacuation alerts. We identify and map out potential evacuation pathways out of your street (by car and by foot). We encourage each other to harden our homes and create defensible space at the neighborhood level, mitigating fire risk at the entire community level.

And that's just for preparing for wildfire evacuation events. We also prepare neighborhoods to help each other after a major shelter-in-place event, such as a major earthquake. Neighbors pool resources and organize a response plan in case of a major earthquake to make sure every neighbor is checked on, to make sure gas meters are secured to prevent the spread of fire, and have radios to communicate efficiently and to have a lifeline out to authorities.

Contact Coordinator@nrgmarin.org to put you in touch with your neighborhood's NRG contacts or learn more on how your neighborhood can support its families prepare to evacuate for wildfire events, as well as for major earthquakes. The Central Marin NRG Program is endorsed by the managers of Corte Madera and Larkspur, Central Marin Fire and Central Marin Police. There aren't enough professional responders on duty at any one time to cover everywhere after a major disaster.

"Preparedness is everyone's job. Not just government agencies but all sectors of society - service providers, businesses, civic and volunteer groups, industry associations and neighborhood associations, as well as every individual citizen - should plan ahead for disaster. During the first few hours or days following a disaster, essential services may not be available. People must be ready to act on their own." California Office of Emergency Services

Located by the beautiful and award-winning Town Park on Tamalpais Drive at Eastman, the Community Center is the perfect venue for wedding receptions, birthdays, business meetings, social gatherings, banquets, fund-raisers, and performances. With total capacity of 350 people, the Community Center includes a large multi-purpose main hall (64'x 43'6"), lounge and wet bar (62'6"x 14'6"), fireplace, stage (20'x 43'4"), meeting rooms, and beautiful gardensetting patio. 




Picnic Refund/Cancellation policy:




